Moving Forward

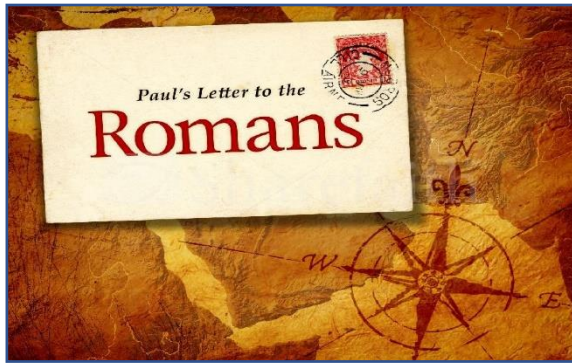

Theology for Thought

On August 20, 2017, we launched our study in the letter that Paul wrote to Rome. I want to keep everyone updated on what we have gone over. Of course, we cannot cover all that was said so I just want to keep people up to date on a few thoughts from these sermons. August 20th, we introduced the letter and went over verse one. On the 27th we continued in Paul's introduction. On September 3rd we went over why Paul wrote this letter and on September 10th we went over Paul not being ashamed of the Gospel. Four weeks in and we have only covered 17 verses out of chapter one. Here is what I want the reader of this newsletter to think about out of these verses. Paul states in verses 9 and 10 out of the first chapter in Romans that he prays that God will get him to Rome. After that Paul said; "For I long to see you so that I may impart some spiritual gift to you, that you may be established;" (Romans 1:11, NASB95). Then again in verse 13 he tells the church he has often intended to come but has been prevented so far. Three times Paul lets this church know that he really wants to be there but has been prevented. It seems Paul does not understand why he has been prevented, he just knows he has been prevented. At this point Paul must have been asking why. He must have said, I don't understand, I want to teach these people, why am I being prevented. There are times in our lives when we may not understand what God is doing. We ask why and probably are constantly in prayer like Paul. And like Paul, we cannot see the big picture of what God is doing. Paul did not see what the big picture was, how could he? There was no way. Paul must have thought, 'well, if I can't go and see them, I will just write to them.' There is the reason why Paul has been kept from going to Rome. Had Paul gone we would not have this letter. Had Paul gone, Christians would not have the richness and greatness that is found in this letter to Rome. We may not always see the big picture, but we must trust that God "causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose." (Ro 8:28).

New Sunday School
